On 20 January 2012 the National Institutes of Health (NIH) issued the FY 2012 stipend levels for trainees and fellows receiving Ruth L. Kirschstein National Research Service Awards (NRSA): <http://grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/notice-files/NOT-OD-12-033.html>.

The published stipend levels have increased almost two percent over the FY 2011 levels. The FY 2012 stipend levels are retroactive for all Kirschstein-NRSA awards made on or after 1 October 2011
